There are a couple of important updates to share about Carolina Water Service, the private sewer company with a history of polluting the Lower Saluda River.

Earlier this month DHEC fined CWS almost \$80,000 dollars for violations at their Friarsgate wastewater plant that led to a no-swimming advisory at Saluda Shoals Park last summer. The DHEC consent order also required CWS to submit a corrective action plan and take several steps to fix the problems at their plant and improve their compliance monitoring. Congaree Riverkeeper will be in court tomorrow (Thursday, March 30th) defending DHEC's denial of the re-issuance of the NPDES permit for Carolina Water Service's I-20 wastewater plant. DHEC denied the permit in August of 2016, but CWS appealed the denial. The hearing will be at 10:00 am at the South Carolina Administrative Law Court in Columbia.
